FIRST CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF THE TUSKITORY OF GUAM

Minutes of the Thirty-Sinth General Session

The Thirty-Sixth General Session of the First Constitutional Convention of the Territory of Guam convened at Convention Headquarters on May 25, 1970 at 7:15 p.m. Mr. Jose C. Quintanilla, Vice-President of the First Constitutional Convention, presided.

PRAYER

Father Cruz offered the following prayer:

"In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

God of Heaven and Earth, Who have said, when you stand up there to pray, forgive whatever you have against anyone, that your Father in Heaven may also forgive you your offenses. We humbly beg that we may be enlightened by your Grace, to realize how this work of many hands show forth the importance of the individual and, therefore, should draw in peace. This provision would also include a call for referendum for the people to ratify any proposed changes.

(2) The introduction of a proposition calling for districting.

The committee also discussed the possibility that the legislature will not grant an extension or the supplemental budget request. The Executive Committee plans to meet as soon as the fate of the bill is known.

Dy direction of the President, The Administrative Secretary read letters from the Executive Committee reporting out substitute Propposition Nos. 16A and 27A.
