Minutes of the Thirty-Sixth General Session

The Thirty-Sixth General Session of the First Constitutional Convention of the Territory of Guam convened at Convention Headquarters on May 25, 1970 at 7:15 p.m. Mr. Jose C. Quintanilla, Vice-President of the First Constitutional Convention, presided.

PRAYER

Father Cruz offered the following prayer:

"In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.
God of Heaven and Earth, Who have said, when you stand up there to pray, forgive whatever you have against anyone, that your Father in Heaven may also forgive you your offenses. INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSITIONS AND RESOLUTIONS AND REFERENCES TO COMMITTEE

Mr. Gregorio M. Borja moved to suspend the rules to place Proposition No. 58 on the order of second reading. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, by unanimous consent.

Ordered, That Proposition No. 58 be placed on the order of second reading on the agenda.

Mr. Francisco P. Santos moved to suspend the rules to act on all propositions on third reading. Objection - motion defeated.

Mr. Franklin J. Quitugua moved to suspend the rules to place Proposition No. 14A on the order of second reading.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Executive Committee - Mr. Antonio M. Palomo reported that the Executive Committee met May 25. After looking over the Organic Act the committee discussed the following proposals:

- (1) Adding a provision to allow future amendment of the Organic Act.
- A provision which would call for a Convention every 10 years to review the Organic Act.

This provision would also include a call for referendum for the people to ratify any proposed changes.

(2) The introduction of a proposition calling for districting.

The committee also discussed the possibility that the legislature will not grant an extension or the supplemental budget request. The Executive Committee plans to meet as soon as the fate of the bill is known.

By direction of the President, The Administrative Secretary read letters from the Executive Committee reporting out substitute Proposition Nos. 16A and 27A.

Mr. President announced that the Executive Committee held a meeting at noon today. The committee decided that if the Convention is not granted an extension, the report must be limited to the recommended changes and a narrative explaining the proposed changes.

Page 1, line 8, strike out the words "and a natural born citizen of Guam, provided that at least one of said".

Page 1, line 9, strike out the words "person's parents is a natural born citizen of Guam". Seconded.

Mr. Joaquin G. Blaz moved to amend said motion as follows:

Page 1, line 6, after the words "has been" insert the words "a resident of Guam and a citizen of the United States".

Page 1, line 7, after the word "preceding" strike out the word "the" and insert the word "such", strike out the words "a citizen of the United (line 8) States".

Motion seconded and discussion held thereon.

Mr. Gregorio M. Borja moved to refer said proposition to the Executive Committee. Seconded and discussion held thereon. Mr. Borja withdrew his motion.

Mr. Francisco R. Santos moved to pass Proposition No. 58 on file until the next session. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Proposition No. 27A

Mr. Gregorio M. Borja moved to refer Proposition No. 27A to the Executive Committee. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Proposition No. 18

Mr. Joaquin G. Blaz moved to place Proposition No. 18 in the inactive file. Seconded and discussion held thereon.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Ordered, That Proposition No. 18 be placed in the inactive file.

Page 1, line 8, delete entirely.

Page 1, line 9, strike out the words "person's parents is a natural born citizen of Guam". Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Mr. Borja moved to amend the said proposition as follows:

Page 1, line 10, strike out the words "thirty years of age" and insert the words "thirty-five years of age". Seconded.

Proposition No. 42A

Mr. Joseph F. Ada moved to amend said proposition as follows:

Page 1, line 6, after the word "guaranteed" insert the words "Labor organizations may not strike if such would threaten the health or well-being of the people of Guam".

No second, motion defeated.

Mr. Joaquin G. Blaz moved to place said proposition in the inactive file. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Ordered, That Proposition No. 42A be placed in the inactive file

Proposition No. 14A

Mr. Joseph F. Ada moved to place Proposition No. 14A in the inactive file. Seconded and discussion held thereon.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the negative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present not voting in favor thereof.

Mr. Adrian C. Sanchez moved to pass said proposition on file. Seconded, and discussion held thereon.

Mr. Francisco R. Santos moved to refer said proposition to the Executive Committee until next session. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to Mr. Santos' motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Ordered, That said proposition be referred to the Executive Committee.

NERVE GAS

Mr. Francisco R. Santos moved that the delegates introduce a resolution to protest transfer of nerve gas to Guam. Seconded.

Discussion held thereon.

Mr. Francisco B. Aguon moved to amend said motion, to turn the matter over to the Executive Committee to draft the resolution. Seconded.

Mrs. Betty S. Guerrero moved to amend said motion to allow the Executive Committee to expedite the resolution immediately. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to refer the drafting of a resolution on nerve gas to the Executive Committee and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Proposition No. 55

Mr. Joseph F. Ada moved to pass Proposition No. 55 on file. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Proposition No. 30

Mr. Francisco B. Aguon moved to amend Proposition No. 30 as follows:

Page 1, line 8, after the words "every bill" insert the words "shall be confined to one subject".

Page 1, line 10, after the word "laws" insert a period and strike out the words "shall be confined".

Page 1, line 11, strike out the words "to one subject".

Page 1, line 12, strike out the word "However".

Page 1, lines 13 through 15, delete entirely.

Mr. Joseph F. Ada moved to amend said motion as follows:

Page 1, line 12, strike out the words "to the subject".

Seconded and discussion held thereon.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to Mr. Ada's amendment and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to Mr. Aguon's motion as amended and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Mr. Francisco B. Aguon moved to place said proposition on the order of third reading. Seconded and discussion held thereon.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to the advancement of said proposition and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Ordered, That Proposition No. 30 be placed on the order of third reading.

Proposition No. 19

Mr. Francisco B. Aguon moved to place Proposition No. 19 on the order of third reading. Seconded and discussion held thereon.

Mr. Adrian C. Sanchez moved to place said proposition in the inactive file. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to said motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Ordered, That Proposition No. 19 be placed in the inactive file.

Proposition No. 7

Mr. Joaquin G. Blaz moved to pass Proposition No. 7 or file. Seconded.

Mr. Adrian C. Sanchez moved to place said proposition in the inactive file. Seconded and discussion held thereon. Mr. Sanchez withdrew his motion.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to Mr. Blaz's motion and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.

Proposition No. 15

Mr. Joseph F. Ada moved to place Proposition No. 15 on the order of third reading. Seconded.

Mr. President put the question whether the Convention would agree to the advancement of said proposition and it was determined in the affirmative, a majority of the delegates elected to the Convention and present voting in favor thereof.
