MINUTES OF MEETING

The Twenty-Eighth General Session of the First Constitutional Convention of the Territory of Guam convened at Convention Headquarters at 7:20 p.m., April 6, 1970. Mr. Antonio M. Palomo, President of the Constitutional Convention, presided. The meeting was called to order.

PRAYER

ROLL CALL AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE


