A PROPOSITION TO AMEND SUBSECTION  
(b) OF SECTION 29 OF THE ORGANIC  
ACT OF GUAM RELATIVE TO PUBLIC

1 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE FIRST CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF THE TERRITORY  
2 OF GUAM:

3 Section 1. Subsection (b) of Section 29 of the Organic Act of Guam is  
4 hereby amended to read as follows:

5 "(b) Subject to the laws of Guam, the the Governor shall provide an  
6 adequate public educational system of Guam, and to that end shall establish,  
7 maintain, and operate public schools at such places in Guam as may be necessary."

President Nixon has proclaimed the week of September 17 to 23 as Constitution Week to commemorate the signing of the U.S. Constitution on September 17, 1787.

Acting Governor Moylan has duplicated this proclamation for Guam with special reference to Guam's First Constitutional Convention.

Projects which have been planned for this week are as follows:

- a) Two page special in Guam Daily News
- b) Special television program for Friday, September 19, at 8:00 p.m. featuring University of Guam students speaking on Guam's political future as they foresee it
- c) Mail campaign to all organizations on Guam encouraging interest and speaking engagements
- d) All social studies teachers of public schools and the university informed and encouraged to prepare units on the Constitution and Guam's Convention
- e) Speaking engagements to cover all government and Guam history classes of J.F.K. High School, the National Honor Society of G.W. High School, and the fourth, fifth, and sixth grades of New Piti Elementary School
- f) Thirty second taped announcement by Tony Palomo repeated on KUAM radio throughout the week urging public interest and participation in the Convention
- g) Exhibits prepared by J.F.K. High School art students in various places on the island
