Subject: Television programs

Mrs. Laling Camacho, of KUAM, has granted us a weekly half-hour program devoted to the Convention which will begin the first week in September. Mrs. Camacho has not yet been able to tell me what day or what time the program will occur. I will inform you as soon as I have this information.

In an effort to preserve the activities of the Constitutional Convention for later study by students on Guam, the Public Information Officer and the Learning Resource Center of the Department of Education are working to produce a video tape about the Convention.

This taping will be at our meeting on WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 25, at 11:30 a.m. at Convention headquarters. The topic for discussion is: Which of the political status alternatives should this committee recommend to the Convention body?

Please come prepared for discussion on this question. Although the meeting should be as spontaneous as possible, the members should be prepared to defend or to reject any of the five alternatives considered with some degree of self confidence and coherence.

Please make every effort to attend, as the technicians from the Learning Resource Center will have gone to a great deal of trouble to bring all the equipment to our office and to set it up in preparation. A very embarrassing situation could result if only a few delegates are on hand.
